'There is no sound tree that produces rotten fruit, nor again a rotten tree that produces sound fruit. For every tree can be told by its own fruit: people do not pick figs from thorns, nor gather grapes from brambles. Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat. Lent is when we put our house in spiritual order. The **penitential season** of Lent is a period of forty days beginning on Ash Wednesday, this week, that prepares us for Easter. Our Lenten spiritual preparations should not only be confined to "giving up" things; we should "take on" things - extra prayers, for example, the Rosary, daily Mass and especially family prayers.

Shrove/ Pancake Tuesday

The day before Ash Wednesday, before the Season of Lent, is called:

- ♦ **Shrove Tuesday** - the day when one was shriven = sins remitted after confession;
- ♦ **Carnivale** [Italian] - carnis = meat + vale= bye: good bye to meat day;
- ♦ **Mardi Gras** [*Fat Tuesday*] - when you eat up all the goodies before the fast;
- ♦ **Pancake Tuesday** - put on some pounds before the penance.

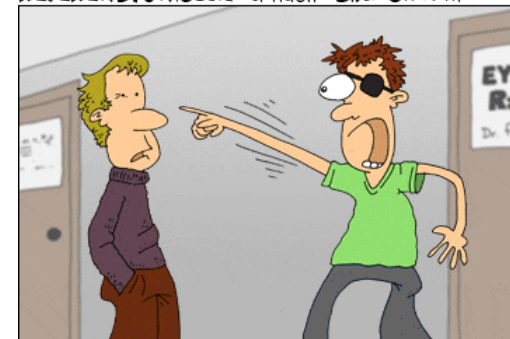
CHILD HUMOUR
