First Reading: Exodus 17: 8-13

The Amalekites came and attacked Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua, 'Pick out men for yourself, and tomorrow morning march out to engage Amalek. I, meanwhile, will stand on the hilltop, the staff of God in my hand.' Joshua did as Moses told him and marched out to engage Amalek, while Moses and Aaron and Hur went up to the top of the hill. As long as Moses kept his arms raised, Israel had the advantage; when he let his arms fall, the advantage went to Amalek. But Moses' arms grew heavy, so they took a stone and put it under him and on this he sat, Aaron and Hur supporting his arms, one on one side, one on the other; and his arms remained firm till sunset. With the edge of the sword Joshua cut down Amalek and his people.

Alleluia, alleluia! The word of God is living and active; it probes the thoughts and motives of our heart. **Alleluia, alleluia!**


A Reading from the holy Gospel according to according to Luke 18:1-8 Glory to you O Lord.

For a long time he refused, but at last he said to himself, "Maybe I have neither fear of God nor respect for man, but since she keeps pestering me I must give this widow her just rights, or she will persist in coming and worry me to death".' 

Perseverance involves resilience.

Often it is this steadfast approach that enables one, with God's grace, to win the battle. Moses was steadfast but not standing - for his weariness overcame his body and thus his arms had to be held up by Aaron and Hur. While his arms were upheld the battle would be won. This bodily posture is one of prayer. In the Divine Liturgy, the priest, interceding for God's people in spiritual battle hold out his arms in prayer, as did Moses. Often when we are weary God's holds us up by his strength. In all situations, however, what remains essential is a fixed will. Perseverance just does not happen. It must be sought and pursued at all costs.
