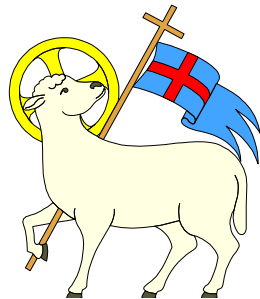

First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:34

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil. Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Since you have been brought back to true life with Christ, you must look for the things that are in heaven, where Christ is, sitting at God's right hand. But when Christ is revealed - and he is your life - you too will be revealed in all your glory with him.

Easter Sequence

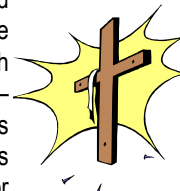
Alleluia, alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. **Alleluia!**

Glory to You O Lord

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.' So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter,

reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head; this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead. **The Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you Lord Jesus Christ.**

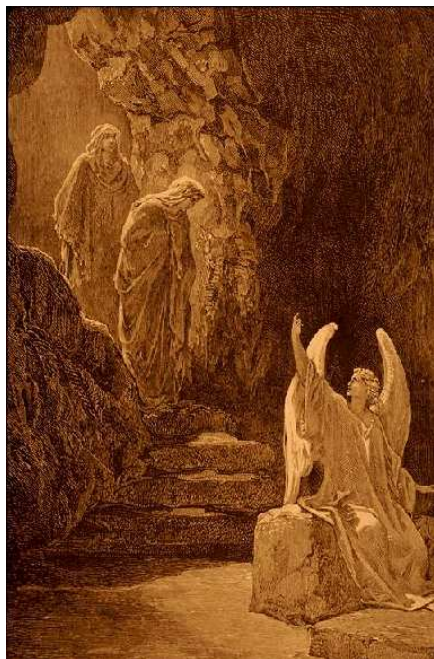

EASTER SUNDAY

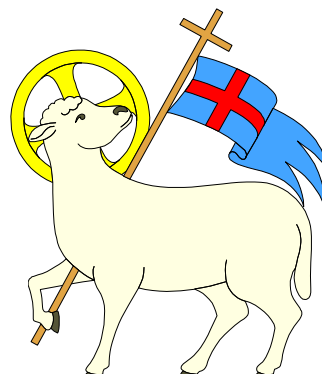
At the Council of Nicaea in 325, the Catholic Church agreed that Easter, the Christian Passover, should be celebrated on the Sunday following the first full moon (14 Nisan) after the vernal equinox (March 21st). The reform of the Western calendar, called "Gregorian" after Pope Gregory XIII 1582, caused a discrepancy of several days with the Eastern calendar. Thus, the Orthodox Churches often don't celebrate the same day, except for this year. Have you noticed the full moon these last few days?

CHRIST is RISEN !

The word easter comes from *eostre* because at this time of the year the winds blew in this direction. For us Christian Catholics Easter is the great feast of the Resurrection of Jesus, who rose by his own power on the third day. As Jesus is true God and true Man he died for our sins and rose to give us new life by means of grace to our souls (hence the symbols of life, bunnies and eggs). Such grace comes to us via the Sacraments, the first being that of Baptism.
