Glory to You O Lord

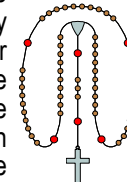
Jesus said to the chief priests and elders of the people: 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who gave a feast for his son's wedding. He sent his servants to call those who had been invited, but they would not come.

Next he sent some more servants. "Tell those who have been invited" he said "that I have my banquet all prepared, my oxen and fattened cattle have been slaughtered, everything is ready. Come to the wedding."

But they were not interested: one went off to his farm, another to his business, and the rest seized his servants, maltreated them and killed them. The king was furious. He despatched his troops, destroyed those murderers and burnt their town. Then he said to his servants, "The wedding is ready; but as those who were invited proved to be unworthy, go to the crossroads in the town and invite everyone you can find to the wedding." So these servants went out on to the roads and collected together everyone they could find, bad and good alike; and the wedding hall was filled with guests. When the king came in to look at the guests he noticed one man who was not wearing a wedding garment, and said to him, "How did you get in here, my friend, without a wedding garment?" And the man was silent. Then the king said to the attendants, "Bind him hand and foot and throw him out into the dark, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth." 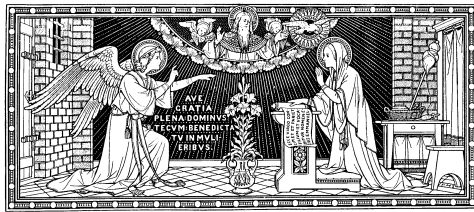

Banquet Invitations & Divine Grace

The entire Christian life bears the mark of the spousal love of Christ and the Church. At Baptism, when entered into the royal family of God precedes the wedding feast of the Holy Eucharist. The Lord's Supper which Christ took with his disciples on the eve of his Passion anticipates the wedding feast of the Lamb in the heavenly Jerusalem. Both here and in heaven to partake of this feast the faithful need to be clothed in **sanctifying grace**. Hence the white robe used in baptismal ceremonies which is a symbol of that grace, also called **habitual** grace. It is *this* grace that we must possess in our soul at death, sometimes called the state of grace, [which can be lost by mortal sin] so as to be saved and thus welcomed into the banquet of eternal life with God.

Sanctifying grace is joined to the virtue of charity just as fingers belong to a hand. Lose one you lose all!



God's grace gives us power to do all things. It can be called dynamic for it is a great source of interior strength. When we worthily receive His Sacraments we download that power that makes all things possible. Superstitions fail to provide the help and assistance we need, they are a misplaced trust, that cannot but lead to failure and disappointment. One great woman who knew the power of divine grace and did great things for God and others was Saint Teresa of Avila.

On Saturday 10th October 2020 in Assisi Carlo (Charles) Acutis will be beatified. He was born in 1991 and died at the young age of 15 years old of Leukemia offering his suffering for the Church. During



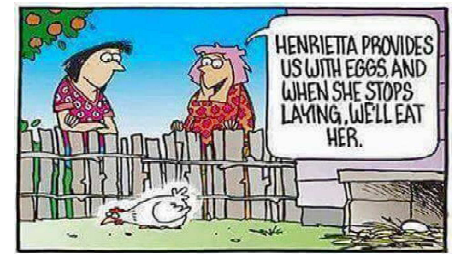
his short years in Milan, Italy he was filled with a love of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist. He was also a computer guru and enjoyed sport and computer games. Carlo went to daily Mass and prayed the Rosary every day. He combined his two loves by setting up a web site on Eucharistic Miracles. Blessed Carlo pray for us.

Saint Teresa

Feast on 15th October



St. Teresa of Jesus was born at Avila in Spain on 28 March, 1515 and died in 1582. Teresa was brought up by her saintly father, a lover of serious books, and a tender mother. After entering religious life she became very ill and nearly died. After a prolonged cure she was eventually healed by St. Joseph. During these years of suffering she began the practice of meditation and God blessed her with 'intellectual visions'. One vision depicted hell, a state for those who die in mortal sin - which inspired her to seek a more perfect life. The whole city of Avila was troubled by the reports of this nun contained in her autobiography *The Life*. Teresa also experienced a spiritual piercing or transverberation of the heart, spiritual espousals and the mystical marriage. After much opposition she founded numerous convents of Discalced Carmelites. St. Teresa's position among writers on mystical theology is unique. Under obedience she wrote four books which contain the best explanations of prayer and meditation. One is called the **Way of Perfection**.
