
'Give unto Ceasar' refers to the Fourth Commandment: Honour your mother and your father.

2234 God's fourth commandment also enjoins us to honor all who for our good have received authority in society.

2237 Political authorities are obliged to respect the fundamental rights of the human person. They will dispense justice humanely by respecting the rights of everyone, especially of families and the disadvantaged.

2240 Submission to authority and co-responsibility for the common good make it *morally obligatory to pay taxes*, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country.

2242 *The citizen is obliged in conscience not to follow the directives of civil authorities when they are contrary to the demands of the moral order, to the fundamental rights of persons or the teachings of the Gospel. "Render therefore to Caesar the things that are Caesar's, and to God the things that are God's." "We must obey God rather than men" Acts 5:29.*

Blessed Louis and Zélie Martin, the parents of Saint Thérèse, were beatified on October 19, 2008 in the basilica dedicated to their daughter at Lisieux in France. The first

parents of a saint to be beatified, they are the first spouses in the history of the Church to be proposed for sainthood as a couple and the second to be beatified together. They taught the faith to their children and in particular the youngest daughter, Thérèse, now a doctor of the Church. Zélie and Louis were not declared "blessed" because of Thérèse. She became a saint because of them.

Could travel round the earth.


So if you feel a smile begin
