First Reading: Isaiah 5: 1-7

Let me sing to my friend the song of his love for his vineyard. My friend had a vineyard on a fertile hillside. He dug the soil, cleared it of stones and planted choice vines in it. In the middle he built a tower, he dug a press there too. He expected it to yield grapes, but sour grapes were all that it gave. And now, inhabitants of Jerusalem and men of

Judah, I ask you to judge between my vineyard and me. What could I have done for my vineyard that I have not done? I expected it to yield grapes. Why did it yield sour grapes instead? Very well, I will tell you what I am going to do to my vineyard: I will take away its hedge for it to be grazed on, and knock down its wall for it to be trampled on. I will lay it waste, unpruned, undug; overgrown by the briar and the thorn. I will command the clouds to rain no rain on it. Yes, the vineyard of the Lord of Hosts is the House of Israel, and the men of Judah that chosen plant. He expected justice, but found bloodshed, integrity, but only a cry of distress.


A reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 21:33-43

Jesus said to the chief priests and the elders of the people, 'Listen to another parable. There was a man, a landowner, who planted a vineyard; he fenced it round, dug a winepress in it and built a tower; then he leased it to tenants and

went abroad. When vintage time drew near he sent his servants to the tenants to collect his produce. But the tenants seized his servants, thrashed one, killed another and stoned a third. Next he sent some more servants, this time a larger number, and they dealt with them in the same way. Finally he sent his son to them. "They will respect my son" he said. But when the tenants saw the son, they said to each other, "This is the heir. Come on, let us kill him and take over his inheritance." So they seized him and threw him out of the vineyard and killed him. Now when the owner of the vineyard comes, what will he do to those tenants?' They answered, 'He will bring those wretches to a wretched end and lease the vineyard to other tenants who will deliver the produce to him when the season arrives.' Jesus said to them, 'Have you never read in the scriptures: It was the stone rejected by the builders that became the keystone. This was the Lord's doing and it is wonderful to see?' I tell you, then, that the Kingdom of God will be taken from you and given to a people who will produce its fruit.



Christian denominations and the Sacraments

LUTHERAN - started in 1520 by Martin Luther in Germany, who was an ex-Catholic priest that wanted to reform the Church. He adopted the Bible 'alone' theory, changed the teachings on grace & salvation and reduced the sacraments to two: baptism and marriage - and denied the existence of the Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick. He removed seven books from the Bible and tried to remove the letter of St. James in the New Testament.

ANGLICAN - started by King Henry VIII of England [anglis=english]. Henry was once a loyal Catholic. In 1521 he wrote a book against Luther on the Seven Sacraments - *Assertio Septem Sacramentorum* and the Pope awarded him the title 'Defender of the Faith.' Over ten years later, in 1529, when Henry couldn't exchange Queen Catherine for his mistress Ann Boleyn, he changed the Church making himself its 'head'. From 1529-1559 Catholic England became a protestant country where Catholics would be hunted, tortured and murdered for supposed treason. Anglicans also deny the existence of the Sacrament of the Sick. The head of their church is the Queen.

✠ **St. Edmund Campion sj** is one of many Catholic heroes who was murdered during the English reformation for being a Catholic priest, saying Mass, and administering the Sacraments. Fr. Edmund was a convert from the Church of England, who was famous for his erudite scholarship and brilliant wit. Even Queen Elizabeth



regarded him as exceptional. In Sydney, a liberal Arts College is called **CAMPION COLLEGE** named after this legendary Jesuit martyr.
