First Reading: Prophet Jonah 3:1-10

The word of the Lord was addressed to Jonah: 'Up!' he said 'Go to Nineveh, the great city, and preach to them as I told you to.' Jonah set out and went to Nineveh in obedience to the word of the Lord. Now Nineveh was a city great beyond compare: it took three days to cross it.

Jonah went on into the city, making a day's journey. He preached in these words, 'Only forty days more and Nineveh is going to be destroyed.' And the people of Nineveh believed in God; they proclaimed a fast and put on sackcloth, from the greatest to the least. God saw their efforts to renounce their evil behaviour. And God relented: he did not inflict on them the disaster which he had threatened.

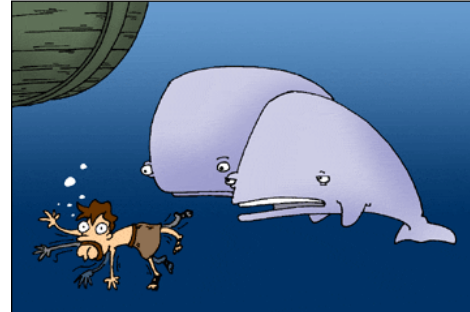

Jonah was a reluctant preacher - he was not keen to evangelize the people of Nineveh. Why? He thought that they were unworthy or not-up-to-scratch, unlike the Jews. A prophet is a teacher who is sent to teach or pass on the message. The Sender who is God does ask our opinion about those who are in need of evangelising. It doesn't matter what the messenger thinks. His job is to proclaim the truths that have been entrusted to him. He is the messenger with a message that has to be delivered.

On Australia Day

Here are some notes on 'Terra Australis'



In 1676, Fr. Victorio Riccio, a Dominican priest, wrote to Rome from the Philippines seeking permission to begin a Mission in Australia. The letter contained much detail and information regarding the country called *Terra Australis*. And to accompany his request, Fr. Riccio enclosed a hand drawn map (30cm x 40cm) the first ever of the continent

of Australia, which he called the fifth part of the world - *quinta pars orbis*. Fr. Riccio claimed that it was a land of innumerable kingdoms and nations. Dutch explorers had told him that one could walk through the interior of this country for two years without ever seeing the sea.



Many years later in the year 1788, 112 years after Riccio's letter, the British Empire claimed this land as a penal colony for prisoners. Catholics were often deprived of the support of their Church and the Sacraments. The Holy Eucharist, at one stage, was reserved in the Davis house for two whole years until a priest arrived. The Davis home, the 'Holy House of Australia,' became a centre of devotion and prayer. Today one can visit this humble dwelling in The Rocks, Sydney, nearby St. Patrick Church.

HOLEY HELP

While boarding an old ferry in Bangladesh, a medical doctor was appalled to see a small child sitting on the bottom deck with people walking

all over him kicking and complaining that he was in the way. He approached the captain of the ferry and voiced his concerns about the child not having a proper seat. The captain replied that he was employing the child in that capacity. The doctor implored the captain to have compassion who simply responded: "Sir, if the child gets up... we shall all go down!"
