

Comfort Zone

So often what happens in life, or what does not happen, depends on making the right connections. As the old saying goes: "It is not what you know but who you know that makes all the difference."

The Apostles during the storm failed to connect to Our Lord. He was with them, in their very midst, yet they complained instead of praying. Once He finally resolved the issue and calmed their fears then they were filled with awe. At this stage of their formation they still had not connected to the fact that Christ is God and there are no limits to His divine power - but we limit Him by not making the right connections by resisting His grace and not moving out of our comfort zone.

In the first reading we are reminded of how Job was tested beyond the limits of most but never lost sight of the big picture and God's presence.

BIBLE matters in the MASS



• *Question*: Where did the Sign of the Cross come from?

Answer: St Paul said: "God forbid that I should glory save *in the cross* of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Gal. 6:14). The Bible reminds us to respect the cross. From early days Christians made the sign of the cross on themselves. In the year 211, the Christian Writer Tertullian refers to this common practice: "When lighting the lamps [in Church], when reclining [for a meal], when sitting, in all ordinary occupations of daily lives, we furrow our forehead with the sign [of the cross]" Crown, 3,2.
