A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 6: 1-15
Glory to You O Lord

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover. Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii

would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.

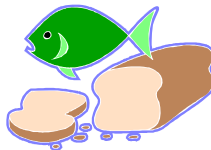

One Baptism, and One Eucharist..

The First Reading from II Kings prepares one for the miracle of the multiplication of loaves and fishes in the Gospel. Elisha was able to feed, by God's grace, one hundred men with twenty barley loaves and some fresh grain. In St John's Gospel the crowd notices the concern Jesus has for them who intends to teach them so that He can feed their souls. Today we have come to this Church to be fed by the same Christ who stood on the mount and fed His people. We have come not to fill our stomachs; we have come for the Bread of Life. Our souls are fed weekly in Holy Communion with the food of immortality, the pledge of eternal life: 'Unless you eat my Body and drink my Blood you shall not have life in you' says the Lord. May Holy Communion grant each one of us healing and strength and may it call forth from our hearts a generosity which will cause us to give ourselves to one another and to all who hunger for love.
