They said to him, 'Allow us to sit one at your right hand and the other at your left in your glory.' 'You do not know what you are asking' Jesus said to them.

'Can you drink the cup that I must drink, or be baptised with the baptism with which I must be baptised?' They replied, 'We can.' Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.' When the other ten heard this they began to feel indignant with James and John, so Jesus called them to him and said to them, 'You know that among the pagans their so-called rulers lord it over them, and their great men make their authority felt. This is not to happen among you. No; anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant, and anyone who wants to be first among you must be slave to all. One hard rule for life comes from today's Gospel. "Anyone who wants to become great among you must be your servant." For Christ came not to be served but to serve and to give his life for others. The recipe for everyone's life: to give rather than get! To be there for others rather than oneself. Yet how hard it is to practise on a daily basis. We are hardwired for selfishness - it's all about me. Add to this drama, the selfish culture of today which has been fostered over the last fifty years, on account of pop psychology in the seventies, claiming that self fulfillment came from self help therapy. Then, the nineties ushered in rampant materialism and excessive bodily indulgence resulting in pleasure addictions of our present age (alcohol, drugs, eating, porn). In spite of it all, the saints remain marvelous examples of how to reset our focus and live for others.



### Louis & Zélie Martin, parents of Saint Thérèse of Lisieux are saints.

Blessed Louis and Zélie Martin, the parents of Saint Thérèse, were beatified on October 19, 2008 in the basilica dedicated to their daughter at Lisieux in France. The first parents of a saint to be beatified, they are the first spouses in the history of the Church to be proposed for sainthood as a couple and the second to be beatified together. They taught

the faith to their children and in particular the youngest daughter, Thérèse, now a doctor of the Church. Zélie and Louis were not declared "blessed" because of Thérèse. She became a saint because of them.

And get the world infected!*



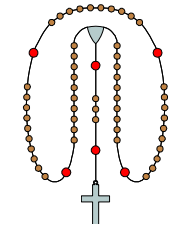
### BROAD HUMOUR
