Ash Wednesday is a day of fasting and abstinence from meat. Lent is when we put our house in spiritual order. The penitential season of Lent is a period of forty days beginning on Ash Wednesday, this week, that prepares us for Easter. Our Lenten spiritual preparations should not only be confined to "giving up" things; we should "take on" things - extra prayers, for example, the Rosary, daily Mass and especially family prayers.

Shrove/ Pancake Tuesday

The day before Ash Wednesday, before the Season of Lent, is called:

- **Shrove Tuesday** the day when one was shriven = sins remitted after confession;
- Carnivale [Italian] carnis = meat + vale= bye: good bye to meat day;
- Mardi Gras [Fat Tuesday] when you eat up all the goodies before the fast;
- Pancake Tuesday put on some pounds before the penance.



CARPE DIEM


