

Moses was looking after the flock of Jethro, his father-in-law priest of Midian. He led his flock to the far side of the wilderness and came to Horeb, the mountain of God. I want to remind you, brothers, how our fathers were all guided by a cloud above them and how they all passed through the sea. They were all





# **Types of Sin**

- 1). Original sin we inherit as human beings.
- 2). Personal sins are twofold: venial [everyday] and mortal [serious]. Mortal sins destroy God's grace and love in our souls. We are healed in the Sacrament of Penance provided we are disposed with true sorrow for our sins; confession of all known sins and satisfaction for sins penance. We commit a mortal sin if three conditions are present:



- 1. full knowledge we know it is wrong.
- 2. full consent we choose to do it.
- 3. grave matter it is a serious matter.

# **Repent of Sin**

Sin is always an offense against God. We sin when we transgress God's law in thought, word or deed. Sin wounds the soul & weakens our love for God and others. Sometimes on our journey Calvary.

He does this through the Sacrament of Penance (which is also known as Confession or Reconciliation). Jesus gave his apostles power and authority to reconcile us to the Father. They received Iesus' own power to forgive sins when he breathed on them and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained" (John 20:22-23). St. Paul notes that "all this is from God, who has reconciled us to himself through Christ and given us the *ministry* of reconciliation... we are ambassadors for Christ, as if God were appealing through us" (2 Cor. 5:18–20).
