I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ

The woman, a sinner, is freed from sinners by our Saviour. Only the sinless are innocent before the gaze of divinity. All of



us, without exception are sinners and thus we are unable to accuse others of their sins, lest we ourselves be accused. Perhaps that is what Our Lord was writing - the sins of those around him, which explains why the older ones left first.

Compassion always requires conversion. So once this woman is forgiven she is told to sin no more. After having been forgiven her sin by He who is sinless, she too becomes sinless by leaving her sinful past behind - she begins anew. True compassion always leads to heartfelt conversion. Compassion without conversion is a farce and conversion without compassion is harsh.

A few years ago, Norma McCorvey who was alias "Jane Roe" in the 1973 Roe v. Wade United States Supreme Court case, which led to the legalization of abortion was received into the Catholic Church. When asked why she became a Catholic Norma said: "I felt serene there," she told a pro-life news service. "I felt safe. And for me, that's saying a lot." She met the compassion of Christ and converted. God's mercy has no limits!

Christianity is quite unique in recognizing the element of trial at the heart of man's religion, and that it seems to have been determined in the designs of God that there would be no salvation without struggle and pain. The very redemption of the human race was conditioned on the Lord becoming man and expiating sin to the last degree.
