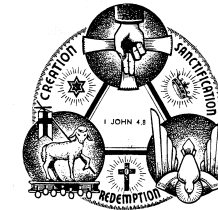
Second Reading: Romans 5:1-5

The Trinity by Rublev-15th century icon

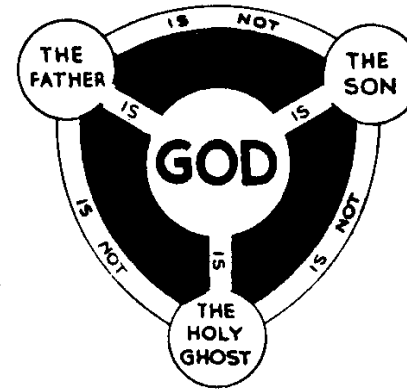

📖 Catholic Catechism says:

CCC 233 Christians are baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Not in their names, for there is only **one** God, the almighty Father, his only Son and the Holy Spirit: the Most Holy Trinity. [*Three Persons who equally possess the same divine Nature*]

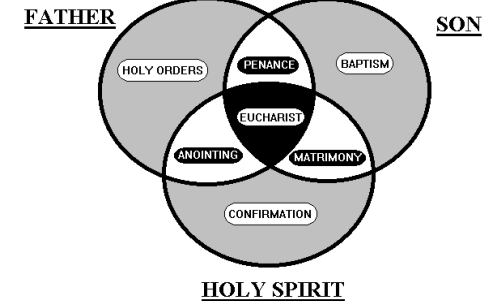
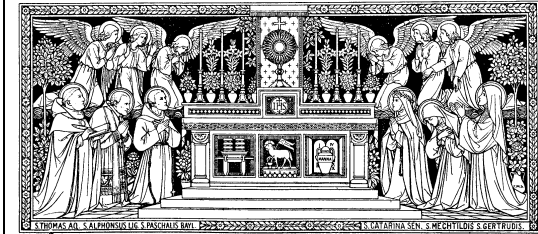
