But they said, 'We have no more than five loaves and two fish, unless we are to go ourselves and buy food for all these people' For there were about five thousand men. Then he took the five loaves and the two fish, raised his eyes to heaven, and said the blessing over them; then he broke them and handed them to his disciples to distribute among the crowd. 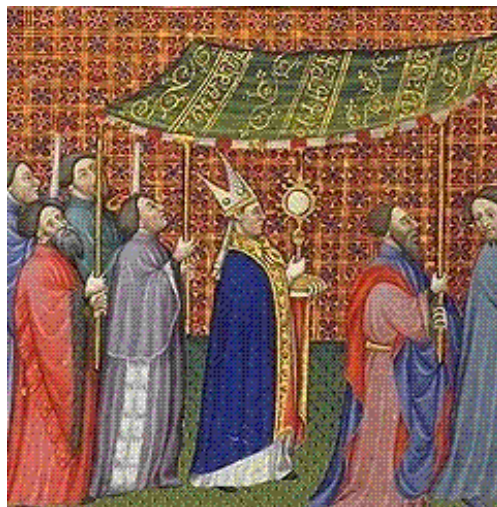

Feast of Corpus Christi Feast of the Body of Christ

It is ancient and dates back to the 13th Century. Fr. Peter of Prague was offering Mass at the Chapel of St Christine at Bolsena near Orvieto when the host after the consecration began to bleed and the Blood stained the altar and the sacred linen. Some of it was taken to Orvieto where Pope Urban was residing and he declared it a miracle and instituted this feast in honour of the real presence of Christ in the Sacrament of the Eucharist - Holy Communion. He petitioned a brilliant Theologian, St Thomas Aquinas, to write the hymns and Mass parts - we are singing those hymns today.

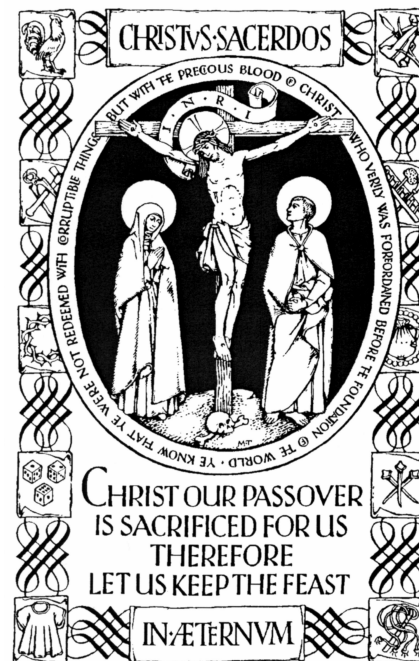
Liturgy of the Eucharist in the Mass comprises three phases:

- ♦ **Offertory:** we offer ourselves with Christ to God the Father;
- ♦ **Consecration:** we relive the death of Christ now sacramentally re-presented at Lavington;
- ♦ **Communion:** we draw spiritual life for the soul from the Host, the glorious Body of Christ - a foretaste of our resurrection.

Real Presence



St. Cyril of Jerusalem, in a catechetical lecture given in the middle of the fourth century (350 A.D.), said: "*Do not, therefore, regard the bread and wine as simply that; for they are, according to the Master's declaration, the Body and Blood of Christ. Even though the senses suggest to you the other, let faith make you firm. Do not judge in this matter by taste, but be assured by the faith, not doubting that you have been deemed worthy of the Body and Blood of Christ*". Jurgens, p. 361. #846.

3 Conditions for Holy Communion so that it is HOLY:

1. Be a baptized Catholic who believes;
2. Be free of mortal/serious sin;
3. Be fasting for 1 hour beforehand.

Doctrine of Transubstantiation

explains the presence of Christ in the substance of the consecrated Host while the appearances of 'bread' remain.
