Mass parts in Hymn Book - page 128. First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 2:1-11

When Pentecost day came round, they had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech. Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading: I Corinthians 12:3-13

No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' unless he is under the influence of the Holy Spirit. There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. Just as a human body, though it is made up of many parts, is a single unit because all these parts, though many, make one body, so it is with Christ. In the one Spirit we were all baptised, Jews as well as Greeks,

slaves as well as citizens, and one Spirit was given to us all to drink.

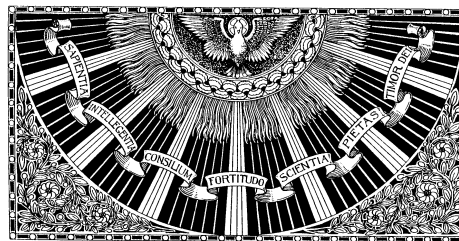

PENTECOST SUNDAY

Pentecost was one of three Jewish feasts in Jerusalem. On this fiftieth day after the Pasch, Jews, in remembrance of the Mosaic Law, would give thanks to God for their harvest. On this same day the Lord sent the Paraclete whom He had promised. The Holy Spirit came down upon the Apostles gathered in prayer together with Mary the Mother of Jesus, in the Upper Room, and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues ... thus bringing back to unity the scattered races. At Pentecost the Holy Spirit came and showed Himself as tongues of fire. For He will kindle charity in us: by which we shall earnestly love God, and think little of the world. In the midst of our problems and disappointments the Church remains faithful to the mystery of her birth. While it is an historical fact that the Church came forth from the day of Pentecost, in a certain sense one can say that she has never left it. Spiritually the event of Pentecost does not belong only to the past: the Church is always in the Upper Room with Christ in her heart. The Holy Spirit, given to the Apostles as the Counselor, is the guardian of hope in the heart of the Church today.

Love in the heart was not put there to stay;
love is not love till you give it away.



WHAT are the Seven Gifts of the Holy Spirit?

Wisdom help me to seek God. Make him the centre of my life. May I be pleasing to Him so that peace and love will be always in my soul.

Understanding gives light to my mind so that I may know and love the truths of faith and make them my own.

Knowledge help me to know good from evil. May I always do what is right in the sight of God
Counsel give me light and guide me in all my ways so that I may always know and do your holy will.

Fortitude give strength to my soul in every time of trouble or danger. Let me never offend God by willful sin and strengthen me against temptation.

Piety live in my heart, draw it to true faith in you to a holy love of you, my God, so that I may always seek you.

Fear of God make me always remember your presence in my soul. Keep me from sin and give me great reverence for God and for all people created in the image and likeness of God.

I recently met an old engineering friend from the past and asked him what he was working on now. He replied that he was working on aqua-thermal treatment of ceramics, aluminium and steel in a

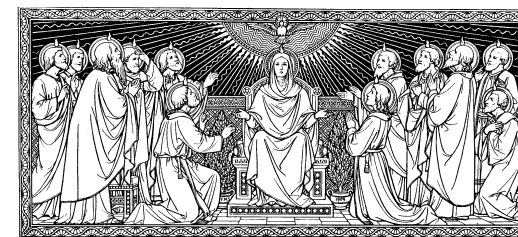
contained environment. I was impressed until, upon further inquiries, I learned that he was washing dishes with hot water under the supervision of his wife!.
