There was a lawyer who, to disconcert Jesus, stood up and said to him, 'Master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' He said to him, 'What is written in the Law? What do you read there?' He replied, 'You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind, and your neighbour as yourself.' 'You have answered right,' said Jesus 'do this and life is yours.' But the man was anxious to justify himself and said to Jesus, 'And who is my neighbour?' Jesus replied, 'A man was once on his way down from Jerusalem to Jericho and fell into the hands of brigands; they took all he had, beat him and then made off, leaving him half dead. Now a priest happened to be travelling down the same road, but when he saw the man, he passed by on the other side. In the same way a Levite who came to the place saw him, and passed by on the other side. But a Samaritan traveller who came upon him was moved with compassion when he saw him. He went up and bandaged his wounds, pouring oil and wine on them. He then lifted him on to his own mount, carried him to the inn and looked after him. Next day, he took out two denarii and handed them to the innkeeper. "Look after him," he said "and on my way back I will make good any extra expense you have." Which of these three, do you think, proved himself a neighbour to the man who fell into the brigands' hands?' 'The one who took pity on him' he replied. Good Samaritan Parable



• KEY PLAYERS:

The Man - is anyone one of us.

Samaritan - from Samaria; unwanted person.

Priest - a religious leader of the Jews.

Levite - a member of a tribal class.

Who is my neighbour?

The **man** is nondescript and if we take the word in a generic sense it can mean anyone - one of us. We are all in need of help at times.

Note that the Parable begins with an answer concerning salvation. For salvation depends on love. Whom should we love? There exists the set order of LOVE - God comes first, then your neighbour & self in last place.

Both the priest and levite, who were the elite, saw the man in need but chose not to help. Be assured that they had their excuses but that is all they had - feeble excuses. The Samaritan, who was lowly regarded in society, saw with his head, not just his eyes, was then moved to help by his heart.

The quality of help was superb - no token gesture of kindness here. He gives him all he needs for physical healing, his own form of transport and even accommodation with meals included. Help far and above the call of duty. Duty would have stopped with assisting him for the day. This fellow even provides for his future needs. True love has not limits.

If love has no limits for strangers what should then exist in the home with those who are family? Sometimes they are our neighbours, sometimes they too are in need. Jesus taught that you should love God with all your heart, soul, strength, and mind; and that you should love your neighbor as yourself.

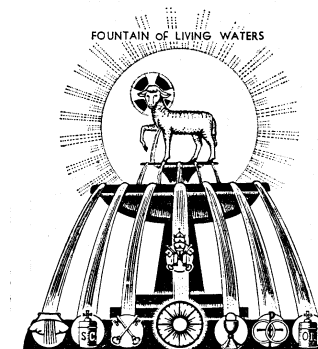
