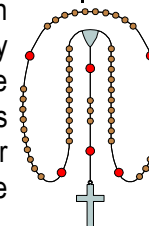
Second Reading: Timothy 1:6-14

Increase our Faith !

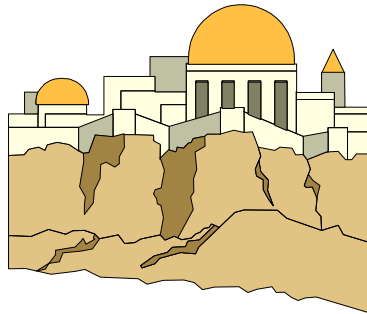
In the Psalm we hear about a place named Massah and Meribah [strife] in the desert near Sinai where Moses struck the rock to provide water for his people; they lacked faith. Ex 17.7

- Habukkuk reminds the people to be faithful so that one remains upright while in exile. Are we not in exile here?

- Saint Paul writes to fellow bishop Timothy encouraging him to remain faithful to sound teaching that comes from Christ and to guard this precious gift.

What is Faith ?

The Italian poet Dante (1265-1321), in the *Divine Comedy* wrote in 'Paradise,' questioned by St. Peter, 'What is faith?': Faith is "**the proof of things not seen.**" The anchor is a symbol of faith.



Our faith is built upon rock. The Rock is Kephass or Peter, the faith entrusted by Christ to the first pope.

CCC 1814 Faith is the theological virtue by which **we believe in God** and believe all that he has said and revealed to us, and that Holy Church proposes for our belief, because he is truth itself.

CCC 1816 The disciple of Christ must not only keep the faith and live on it, but also profess it, confidently **bear witness** to it, and spread it.

Some Christian denominations & the Sacraments

LUTHERAN CHURCH - started in 1520 by Martin Luther in Germany, who was an ex-Catholic priest that wanted to reform the Catholic Church. He adopted the Bible 'alone' theory (sola Scriptura), changed the teachings on grace & salvation and reduced the sacraments to two: baptism and matrimony. He removed seven books from the Bible (Old Testament) and failed in his attempt to remove the Letter of St. James from the New Testament.

ANGLICAN CHURCH - started by King Henry VIII of England [anglis=english]. Henry was once a loyal Catholic. In 1521 he wrote a book against Luther on the Seven Sacraments - *Assertio Septem Sacramentorum* and the Pope rewarded him with the title 'Defender of the Faith.' Over ten years later, in 1529, when Henry couldn't exchange Queen Catherine for his mistress Ann Boleyn, he changed the Church making himself its 'head'. From 1529-1559 Catholic England became a Protestant country, under Queen Elizabeth I, where Catholics would be hunted, tortured and murdered for supposed treason. Anglicans only have two sacraments (as above) and also deny the 'real Presence of Christ in the Holy Eucharist. The head of their Church is now King Charles.

St. Edmund Campion sj is one of many Catholic martyrs

or heroes who was murdered during the English reformation.

He was arrested for being a priest, saying

Mass, and administering the Sacraments. Edmund was a convert from the Church of England,

who was famous for his erudite scholarship and brilliant wit. Even Queen Elizabeth regarded him as exceptional. In Sydney, a liberal Arts College is called **CAMPION COLLEGE** named after this legendary martyr.

MONTH of the ROSARY

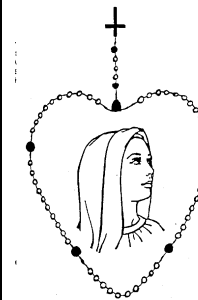
By announcing each mystery and perhaps even using a suitable icon to focus our attention we

improve how we pray the Rosary. The words direct the imagination and the mind towards a

particular episode or moment in the life of Christ. Obviously these mysteries neither replace the Gospel nor exhaust its content. The Rosary, therefore, is no substitute

for *lectio divina*; on the contrary, it presupposes and promotes it. Yet, even though the mysteries contemplated in the Rosary do no more than outline the fundamental elements of the life of

Christ, they easily draw the mind to a more expansive reflection on the rest of the Gospel, especially when the Rosary is prayed in a setting of prolonged recollection. The family that prays together, stays together!
