Lazarus & the Rich Man

The New Testament is so clear on the subject of death and its aftermath that the Gospels are almost thematic on the need for serving God faithfully in this life, because after death there is no chance of repentance. Christ's story about Lazarus and the rich man is unmistakable. When the rich man begged Abraham for some relief from his sufferings, the man was told, "My son, remember that during your life good things came your way, just as bad things came the way of Lazarus. Now he is being comforted here while you are in agony." Yet, the rich man had only feasted sumptuously.

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He didn't hurt Lazarus or other poor people. He just ate too well *every day* while others starved. That is, he **neglected** the poor - **a sin** of omission. And he doesn't say: "This is unfair, I shouldn't be here." He says,

'Have mercy on me. Just get Lazarus to help me.' Where is this man? The answer is not heaven nor hell! St. Teresa says, "There is no love in hell." And yet, this man pleads, not on his own behalf, but for others. "Please send Lazarus back to my five brothers so that they will believe in time." What is very interesting about the story is that it might not be a story! Notice that Jesus raised a man named Lazarus after four days. This might be a parable, but then again Jesus didn't say, 'Let me tell you a parable.' There is no evidence that this is a parable. Also in no parable does Christ name the characters. Here we are told a name and so it could be Lazarus from Bethany who was raised from the dead. It might be a coincidence, but then again, maybe not. What I would suggest is that this is an argument for the existence of purgatory, the purification of sins - including sins of omission that one incurs before eternal life with God.

Sacrifice of the Mass - we owe it all to God

CCC 1366 The Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross, because it is its memorial and because it applies its fruit. At each Mass we pray for those in Purgatory.

Saint Therese

St Therese of Lisieux was born in Alencon, France in 1873. Aged only 15, she

travelled to the Vatican, to personally petition the Pope for permission to be allowed to enter the Convent at this unusually early age. During her short life time St Therese sought to approach God through a path of simplicity and love. She developed a path know as the *little* way. "You know well enough that Our Lord does not look so much at the greatness of our actions, nor even at their difficulty, but at the love at which we do them." St Therese died of tuberculosis at the early age of 24. However her writings were published after her death and have inspired millions.
