*Pride or Humility*

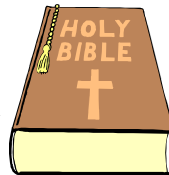
Tax collectors or publicans were despised as agents of a foreign power oppressing their own people, and for contact with pagans, which made them unclean. So the Lord's comment must have amazed the Jews who held the Pharisees, the politically correct and self-righteous as much more worthy of God's blessings.

The publican would not so much as lift up his eyes to heaven; he did not look up, that he might be looked upon. Conscience pressed him down; hope uplifted him. He struck his breast; he sought to punish himself; and for this the Lord had mercy on the repentant. You heard the prideful accuser; you heard the humble accuser. If we confess our own sins and condemn ourselves, we shall be cleansed.

The Pharisee would have sinned much less had he left the Publican alone. He sinned in his thoughts and words. Now in one sentence he attacks the absent, and wounds the only person present. We do not give thanks to God by speaking ill of others. When you give thanks to God, let Him alone be in your thoughts. Do not let your mind turn to others; and do not condemn your neighbour.

**.DAMIEN THE LEPER SAINT**

Pope Benedict XVI canonized Father Damien, who was born Jozef De Veuster in 1840. He was a Roman Catholic priest from Belgium who cared for leprosy victims on the Hawaiian island of Molokai from 1873 to 1889, when the disease killed him. Damien's compassion for the lepers led him to spend **sixteen years** in the "living graveyard that was Molokai," where he died at the age of forty-nine in service to people suffering from the terrible disease of leprosy. Damien never lost sight of his life's purpose, despite the many difficulties and sufferings he bore. It was only his faith that enabled him to endure the trials that his life's work caused him.



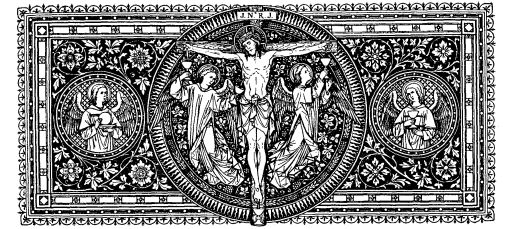
**His Sacrifice of the Cross**
