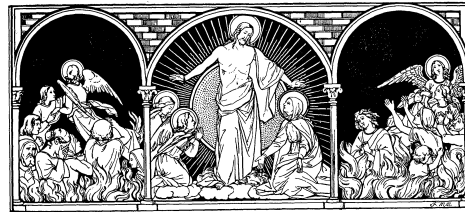

SPIRIT = zoe: divine life



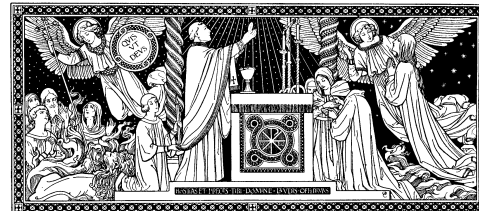
The Greatest Lover
