First Reading: 2 Maccabees 7:1-2, 9-14

There were seven brothers who were arrested with their mother. The king tried to force them to taste pig's flesh, which the Law forbids, by torturing them with whips and scourges. One of them, acting as spokesman for the others, said, 'What are you trying to find out from us? We are prepared to die rather than break the laws of our ancestors.' With his last breath he exclaimed, 'Inhuman fiend, you may discharge us from this present life, but the King of the world will raise us up, since it is for his laws that we die, to live again for ever'. After him, they amused themselves with the third, who on being asked for his tongue promptly thrust it out and boldly held out his hands, with these honourable words, 'It was heaven that gave me these limbs; for the sake of his laws I disdain them; from him I hope to receive them again'. The king and his attendants were astounded at the young man's courage and his utter indifference to suffering. When this one was dead they subjected the fourth to the same savage torture. When he neared his end he cried, 'Ours is the better choice, to meet death at men's hands, yet relying on God's promise that we shall be raised up by him; whereas for you there can be no resurrection, no new life'.

A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke 20:27-38

Glory to you O Lord.

Some Sadducees - those who say that there is no resurrection - approached him and they put this question to him, 'Master, we have it from Moses in writing, that if a man's married brother dies childless, the man must marry the widow to raise up children for his brother. Well then, there were seven brothers. The first, having married a wife, died childless. The second and then the third married the widow. And the same with all seven, they died leaving no children. Finally the woman herself died. Now, at the resurrection, to which of them will she be wife since she had been married to all seven?' Jesus replied, 'The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels, and being children of the resurrection they are sons of God. And Moses himself implies that the dead rise again, in the passage about the bush where he calls the Lord the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac and the God of Jacob. Now he is God, not of the dead, but of the living; for to him all men are in fact alive.'

I AM THE RESURRECTION...

The story of the Maccabees is one of fidelity and heroism that ends in tragedy, except for their belief that they would rise again. Not all Jews then believed in this teaching. It is also a Christian dogma that not all people today believe. Our desire to pray for those who have died arises from this certain notion that after death the body one day shall be reunited with the soul.

This life is not the end - but the beginning of eternal life. Thus, the Gospel reference is to everlasting life (*zoe* in Greek) as distinct to biological life (*bios*). Christ is the source of that eternal life, that begins here and is completed there. He is also the cause of everyone's resurrection since the Lord is the first born from the dead. In eternity we shall fully appreciate these realities which we now grasp with faith. Do you believe?

St. John Lateran Basilica, in Rome

Pope St. Sylvester I (314-35) was the first pope not threatened by a pagan government. After the Edict of Milan, the

Emperor Constantine fostered Christianity and gave to the Church the land for the Basilica (basilica means large church) of the Holy Savior, now popularly called St. John Lateran. Being the first Church built it



has written on its front: *omnium urbis et orbis ecclesiarum mater et caput*; **mother and head** of all the churches of the city and of the world. So it is the mother church of even Holy Spirit, Lavington. Attached to it was the Lateran Palace which became the papal residence, containing the Holy Stairs from Jerusalem and other ancient works of art. The popes lived there until after the Avignon exile (15th century) after which they moved to the Vatican, St. Peter's. But the Lateran Basilica still remains the first church of all churches. A church is the living temple of God because His living flesh - the Eucharist - dwells therein.
