After Jesus had been born in Bethlehem of Judea during the reign of King Herod, some wise men came to Jerusalem from the East. "Where is the

> infant King of the Jews?" they asked. "We saw his star as it rose and have come to do Him homage." When King Herod heard this he was perturbed and so was the whole of Jerusalem. He called together all the chief priests and scribes of the people, and inquired of them where the Christ was to be born. "At Bethlehem in Judea" they told him. "for this is what the prophet wrote: "And

you, O Bethlehem, in the land of Judah, are by no means least among the leaders of Judah; for out of you will come a leader who will shepherd my people Israel." Then Herod summoned the wise men to see Him privately. He asked them the exact date on which the star had appeared and sent them on to Bethlehem. "Go and find out all about the child," he said "and when you have found him, let me know, so that I too may go and do Him homage." Having listened to what the king had to say, they set out. And there in front of them was the star they had seen rising; it went forward and halted over the place where the child was. The sight of the star filled them with delight and going into the house they saw the child with His mother Mary and falling to their knees they did Him homage. Then, opening their treasures, they offered Him gifts of gold and frankincense and myrrh. But they were warned in a dream not to go back to Herod and returned to their own country by a different way.

'Star Of Bethlehem' may have been
the conjunction of Jupiter, Regulus.

The star of Bethlehem mentioned in St. Matthew's Gospel may have been a conjunction of the planets Jupiter, Regulus and a star in the constellation of Leo, according to Mark Thompson, a fellow of the Royal Astronomical Society and Astronomy. Three times in 3 BC and 2 BC, the planet and the star appeared close to each other in the sky.

Epiphany of the Wise Kings

from the Catholic Catechism

(CCC 528) The Epiphany the manifestation of lesus as Messiah of Israel, Son of God and Saviour of the world. The great feast of Epiphany celebrates the adoration of lesus by the wise men (magi) from the East. In the magi, representatives of the neighbouring pagan religions, the Gospel sees the first-fruits of the nations, who welcome the good news of salvation through the Incarnation. The magi's coming to lerusalem in order to pay homage to the king of the lews shows that they seek in Israel, in the messianic light of the star of David, the one who will be king of the nations. Their coming means that pagans can discover Jesus and worship him as Son of God and Saviour of the world.
