
Second Reading: 1st Corinthians 2:6-10

Heart - Head - Action Desire - Thought - Deed

Nothing just happens. All good or bad actions begin on the inside and then become manifest. For that reason we strike our breast THRICE, three times, in the Confiteor at the beginning of Mass as a symbolic gesture to remind us of how deeply rooted are our tendencies.

We are all prone, on account of original sin, to some particular fault. Spiritual theologians call it one's predominant fault. For some it may be pride, others laziness etc. Whatever it is, its taproot goes deep within the heart. For that reason Our Lord reminds us that our virtues need to run deeper.



Virtue - vs - Vices

There are seven virtues to make us holy and seven vices to make us miserable. They will determine our destiny: Heaven or Hell.

The word virtue is linked to vis in Latin which means power; for virtues empower us to do that which is good.

Three are supernatural: faith, hope, charity; four are cardinal: prudence, justice, fortitude, temperance.

The word vice is linked to bad habit and all vices lock us in to that which is not good. A vice binds and enslaves us.

- Pride arrogant and ego centered
- Lust illicit want of bodily pleasure
- Anger unreasoned rage
- Greed disordered want of things
- **Envy** resentment of others
- Gluttony illicit want of food/drink
- Sloth lack of effort, laziness

All to often Good Enough is where the weak hearts stop.


It takes the very best in each for rising to the top.

Kids had hand-me-down clothes from their brothers or sisters, not always brand-new clothing.

But we didn't have the "green thing" back in our day. When we packaged a fragile item to send in the mail, we used wadded up old newspapers to cushion it, not Styrofoam or plastic bubble wrap. We exercised by working so we didn't need to go to a health club to run on treadmills that operate on electricity.

But she's right; we didn't have the "green thing" back then. Thank God for the good old days!
