

> A Reading from the holy Gospel according to Matthew 5: 38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: 'You have learnt how it was said: Eve for eve and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well: if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away. 'You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good. and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.'

Ash Wednesday is a day of <u>fasting</u> and <u>abstinence</u> from meat. Lent is when we put our house in spiritual order. The **penitential season** of Lent is a period of forty days beginning on Ash Wednesday, this week, that prepares us for Easter. Our Lenten spiritual preparations should not only be confined to "giving up" things; we should "take on" things - extra prayers, for example, the Rosary, Adoration at the Chapel, daily Mass and especially family prayers.

Shrove/ Pancake Tuesday

The day before Ash Wednesday, before the Season of Lent, is called:

- Shrove Tuesday the day when one was shriven = sins remitted after confession;
- ◆ Carnivale [Italian] carnis = meat + vale= bye: good bye to meat day;
- Mardi Gras [Fat Tuesday] when you eat up all the goodies before the fast;
- Pancake Tuesday put on some pounds before the penance.

Lex Talionis of the Jews

The first five books of the Bible are called the Torah which is synonymous with "Law." Interestingly, little discussion concerns the Law until the twenty-first chapter of Exodus. One of the most familiar of these Old Testament laws is the Lex Talionis:

Eye for eye, tooth for tooth,

hand for hand...

The accepted translation is "an eye for an eye." A more literal, though not very helpful translation, would be "an eve under an eve." The word tachat literally means "under." but the sentence lacks any decisive meaning when translated this way. With the coming of God's Son, Jesus Christ, this law - among others - was replaced by the command to love our neighbours. In addition, we are also commanded to love our enemies and to pray for those who hate us! No small deal, one might add. The Lord commands that our hearts be transformed so that we may forgive others as we ourselves are forgiven. Without true forgiveness we cannot become truly perfect. Perfection, by the way, is a pre-requisite of Heaven: 'Be ye perfect as your heavenly Father is perfect'!
