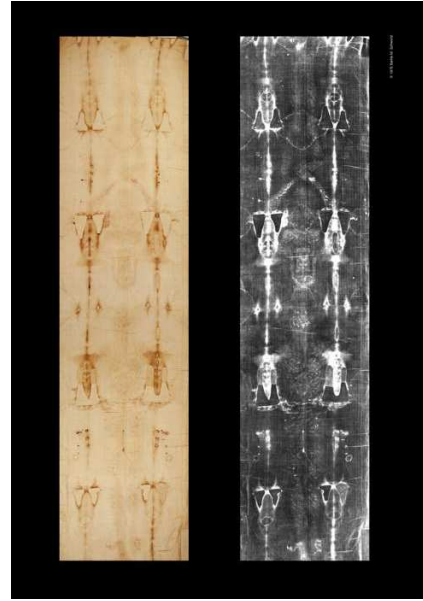


Catholic Caring

Shroud of Turin: burial cloth of Christ.

These features on the Shroud are unknown markings that baffle science
The negative image on the burial cloth shows greater detail - on right side.



Since arriving in Turin in 1578, the Shroud has only been displayed a few times each century. Security is always a problem with the Shroud. For example, there is strong belief by the authorities in Turin that the April 1997 fire in the Chapel, Cathedral and Royal Palace was intentionally set by an arsonist. In 1978, during a 5 week exhibition, 3.5 million visitors flocked to the city to view the cloth. Organizing such events is always a problem. Most importantly however, exposing the cloth to polluted air and UV light during an exhibition can damage the cloth and the image as well. Even though the Shroud is now stored in a specially designed container to protect and preserve it, too much exhibiting may create serious long term conservation and preservation problems.
