

At Holy Mass we offer bread (food) and wine (drink) that take the place of life, Christ's life, which is offered in an unbloody manner to God the Father. We are meant to offer ourselves with those gifts. Never be an idle bystander at Mass - offer your intentions with the gifts at the offertory prayers. That drop of water in the chalice represents your prayers to be united with the Blood of Christ.

OCTOBER: MONTH of the ROSARY

By announcing each mystery and perhaps even using a suitable icon to focus our attention we improve how we pray the Rosary. The words direct the imagination

and the mind towards a particular episode or moment in the life of Christ.... Obviously these mysteries neither replace the Gospel nor exhaust its content. The Rosary, therefore, does not substitute for *lectio divina*; on the contrary, it presupposes and promotes it. Yet, even though the mysteries contemplated in the Rosary do no more than outline the fundamental elements of the life of Christ, they easily draw the mind to a more expansive reflection on the rest of the Gospel, especially when the Rosary is prayed in a setting of prolonged recollection. Listening and meditation are nourished by silence.
