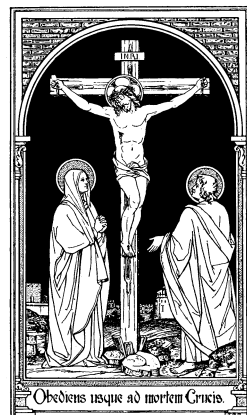

Crutch or a Cross

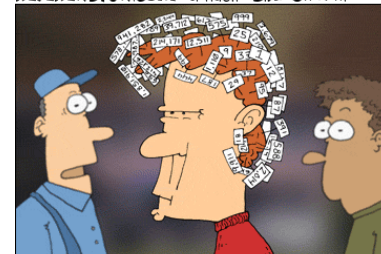
