Moses said to the people: 'Your God will raise up for you a prophet like myself, from among vourselves, from your own brothers; to him you must listen. This is what you yourselves asked of the Lord your God at Horeb on the day of the Assembly. "Do not let me hear again" you said "the voice of the Lord my God, nor look any longer on this great fire, or I shall die": and the Lord said to me, "All they have spoken is well said. I will raise up a prophet like yourself for them from their own brothers; I will put my words into his mouth and he shall tell them all I

command him. The man who does not listen to my words that he speaks in my name, shall be held answerable to me

for it. But the prophet who presumes to say in my name a thing I have not commanded him to say, or who speaks in the name of other gods, that prophet shall die."

2nd Reading: 1st Corinthians 7:32-35

I would like to see you free from all worry. An unmarried man can devote himself to the Lord's affairs, all he need worry about is pleasing the Lord; but a married man has to bother about the world's affairs and devote himself to pleasing his wife: he is torn two ways. In the same way an unmarried woman, like a young girl, can devote herself to the Lord's affairs; all she need worry about is being holy in body and spirit. The married woman, on the other hand, has to worry about the world's affairs and devote herself to pleasing her husband. I say this only to help you, not to put a halter round your necks, but simply to make sure

that everything is as it should be, and that you give your undivided attention to the Lord. The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark 1:21-28 Glory to You O Lord

Jesus and his followers went as far as Capernaum, and as soon as the sabbath came he went to the synagogue and began to teach. And his teaching made a deep

impression on them because, unlike the scribes, he taught them with authority. In their synagogue just then there was a man possessed by an unclean spirit and it shouted. 'What do you want with us. Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are: the Holy One of God.' But Jesus said sharply, 'Be quiet! Come out of him!' And the unclean spirit threw the man into convulsions and with a loud cry went out of him. The people were so astonished that they started asking each other what it all meant. 'Here is a teaching that is new' they said 'and with authority behind it: he gives orders even to unclean spirits and they obey him.' And his reputation rapidly spread everywhere, through all the surrounding Galilean countryside.

Authority of Christ

- AUTHORITY GIVES POWER TO HELP, TO HEAL AND TO MAKE WHOLE.

The story of Jesus in the Capernaum synagogue inaugurates the first day of his ministry that consists of exorcisms and healings. The story reflects contemporary Jewish thought that the coming of God's kingdom would mark the defeat of evil, which is personified in an array of demons and unclean spirits.

Jesus' word is so powerful that people abandon their occupations and follow him, and even demonic powers are powerless before it. Jesus summons people to a change of heart, to take a new look at their lives and put their trust in the Gospel of salvation. This is not simply a story from the past, but one that continues to speak powerfully and prophetically to people today.

On this Fourth Sunday of Ordinary time, both the first reading and the Gospel raise the issue of the authority of those who speak the Word of God. Authentic prophets taught with authority because God put his own words into their mouths.

We have no authority of our own; we simply proclaim his Word. Each member of

the Church, by virtue of their baptism and confirmation, has a prophetic role, and should live out the Word of God , both by word and example. We must walk our talk!

The Psalm this weekend hints at trouble at Meribah and Massah in the desert, where God's people, freed from exile in Egypt, rebelled and would not obey - their hearts had become hardened! Even the heart of Moses hardened and then he disobeyed God. He challenged God's authority. So he was refused access into the promised land.

The WORD of GOD is the INCARNATE WORD

Christ taught the truths of salvation - the Gospel - he entrusted them to his Church. The Apostles preached these truths to the whole

known world. Some of these truths were written down and became known as the Sacred Scriptures - the 27 books of the New Testament.

Other truths were orally passed on, taught as Church Tradition, such as the

birth date of Jesus, the Apostle's Creed, the Assumption of Mary, etc. Also some of these oral truths were handed on at Church Councils, as, for example, at the Council of Jerusalem in AD 50 that decided on what requisite conditions needed to be met for non Jews to enter into the Church. Do you know how many Councils the Church has had over two thousand and twenty-four years? [Ans: 21]
