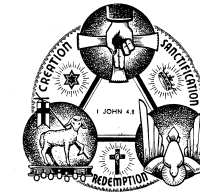
Responsorial Psalm: Happy the people the Lord has chosen to be his own.

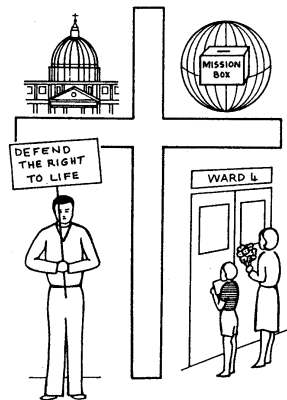

Catholic Confirmation

CCC1298-1302: Confirmation begins with the renewal of baptismal promises and the profession of faith by the confirmands. This clearly shows that Confirmation follows Baptism.

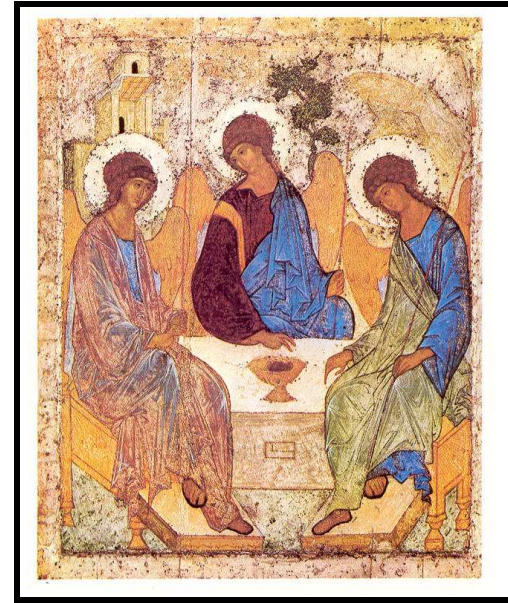
The bishop extends his hands over the whole group of the confirmands. Since the time of the apostles, this gesture has signified the gift of the Spirit. Then the sacrament of Confirmation is conferred through the anointing with chrism on the forehead with the words: 'Be sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit.' The effects are: it roots us more deeply in the divine filiation; it unites us more firmly to Christ; it increases the gifts of the Holy Spirit in us; it renders our bond with the Church more perfect; it gives us a special strength of the Holy Spirit to spread and defend the faith by word and action as true witnesses of Christ, to confess the name of Christ boldly, and never to be ashamed of the Cross.

Confirmation and Baptism impart a sacramental character that seals the soul, and as a consequence, they can only be received once.

The word Trinity is not in the Bible, yet all Christians believe it. It was the Catholic Church that defined the teachings of the Holy Trinity in early Church Councils.



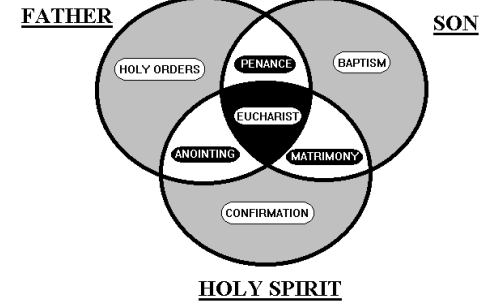
Catholic Catechism says:

CCC 233 Christians are baptized in the **name** of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Not in their names, for there is only **one** God, the almighty Father, his only Son and the Holy Spirit: the Most Holy Trinity. Three Persons who equally possess the same divine Nature.

- **Atheism** is a denial of God's existence by means of argumentation, that is flawed - for it is natural to believe in God. Atheism is thus an acquired belief.

- **Agnosticism** claims that it is impossible to know God or anything about him - a state of indifference. Too many Aussies are agnostics.
