First Reading: Acts of the Apostles 10:25

As Peter reached the house Cornelius went out
to meet him, knelt at his feet and prostrated
himself. But Peter helped him up. "Stand up" he
said "I am only a man after all!" Then Peter
addressed them: "The truth I have now come to
realise" he said "is that God does not have
favourites, but that anybody of any
nationality who fears God and does what
is right is acceptable to him." While Peter
was still speaking the Holy Spirit came
down on all the listeners. Jewish
believers who had accompanied Peter
were all astonished that the gift of the
Holy Spirit should be poured out on the
pagans too, since they could hear them
speaking strange languages and proclaiming
the greatness of God. Peter himself then said,
"Could anyone refuse the water of baptism to
these people, now they have received the Holy
Spirit just as much as we have?" He then gave
orders for them to be baptised in the name of
Jesus Christ. Afterwards they begged him to
stay on for some days.

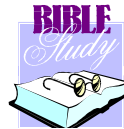

The use of Woman to address His Mother, indicates that the bond is no longer biological but spiritual. Mary is the New Eve whose obedience to God undoes the disobedience of the first woman. So the Mother of Jesus has become our Mother too. The role of Mary is to bring Jesus to us - with haste - as she brought Jesus to Elizabeth and John the Baptist. She is only concerned with the will of her Son. So pray the Rosary often - especially in May.

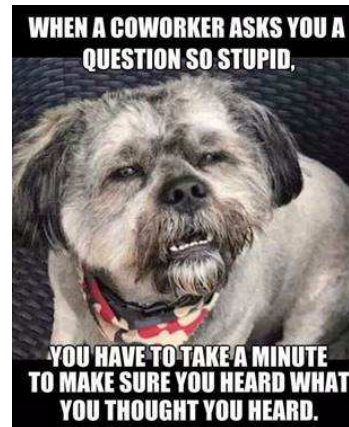
ACTS follows the GOSPELS



The Gospel was oral long before it was written. The word Gospel is old English for God + spell. The Anglo-Saxon word *spellein* meaning to tell: God's telling or story. The teachings of our salvation from Jesus Christ were preached and taught before they were ever written down. The first book after the four Gospels is called the Acts of the Apostles written about 63 AD by Saint Luke, the author of the third Gospel who was not an Apostle and may have never seen Jesus. So what he learnt about Jesus was from oral or preached tradition. His Acts is an historical book recording the birth and expansion of the Church [*Acts means the actions and words of the Apostles*]. It covers a period of thirty-five years, from the Ascension of the Lord unto St Paul's imprisonment in Rome. For that reason it is filled with Catholic gems and insights worthy of our attention.
