3 D's of the Holy Eucharist

- 1. Dogma: what Jesus taught.
- 2. Doctrine: how it is explained.
- 3. Discipline: how it is applied.
- 1. <u>Dogma</u> of the Real Presence: that the real presence of Jesus, body & soul, is present in the consecrated Host. Jesus said: this bread ... is my Flesh!



- 2. Doctrine: the correct theological explanation of this truth is the doctrine of transubstantiation. In the Catechism we read (1376): "that bv the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly properly and called transubstantiation."
- 3. <u>Discipline</u>: the application of these truths three conditions to receive Holy Communion:
- a). be a believing Catholic;
- b). be fasting for 1 hour before hand;
- c). be free of mortal sin.



ASSUMPTION of the BVM

We believe that Mary at the end of her earthly life was assumed body & soul into heaven. This teaching can be traced back to the sixth century - although the idea was implicit in earlier writers when they spoke of Mary's immunity from sin. The Eastern Emperor



Mauritius (582-602) introduced the feast of the Koimesis (Falling Asleep) of the Virgin and ordered its celebration annually throughout the Byzantine Empire on August 15 where it had not yet been observed. In the West, the earliest extant testimony is the statement of Gregory of Tours (d. 596) that "The Lord commanded the holy body [of Mary after her death] to be borne on a cloud to Paradise, where, reunited to its soul, and rejoicing with the elect, it enjoys the never ending happiness of eternity." In recent times, Pope Pius XII taught the Dogma of the Assumption in 1950.

• WHY was Our Lady ASSUMED? Here are 3 reasons

- 1. Since the dissolution of the body is a result of sin, and Mary was sinless, she must have been exempt from the corruption of the grave.
- 2. She was the Mother of God. So that as Christ's body took its existence from her body she shared in His bodily glorification.
- 3. As Christ's Mother she was involved in his redemption of the world. She took a most active part in all that he did on earth and thus deserved, as no one else, to share in the full fruits of the redemption, which consists in the glorification of soul as well as body.

WHERE SHE HAS GONE WE HOPE TO FOLLOW.

In the Book of Revelation the Assumption is magnificently expressed and reminds us that Mary in heaven is still "involved" in the history of salvation, the history of the struggle between good and evil.

Saint Maximilian Kolbe

witnessed to love and life where there was only hate and evil at the Nazi Prison Camp, Auschwitz, during WW II. His feast day is Friday - the day before the Assumption.
