Glory to You O Lord

Jesus was setting out on a journey when a man ran up, knelt before him and put this question to him, 'Good master, what must I do to inherit eternal life?' Jesus said to him, 'Why do you call me good? No one is good but God alone. You know the commandments: You must not kill; You must not commit adultery; You must not steal; You must not bring false witness; You must not defraud; Honour your father and mother.' And he said to him, 'Master, I have kept all these from my earliest days.'

Jesus looked steadily at him and loved him, and he said, 'There is one thing you lack. Go and sell everything you own and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me.' But his face fell at these words and he went away sad, for he was a man of great wealth. Jesus looked round and said to his disciples, 'How hard it is for those who have riches to enter the kingdom of God!' The disciples were astounded by these words, but Jesus insisted, 'My children,' he said to them 'how hard it is to enter the kingdom of God! It is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.' They were more astonished than ever. 'In that case' they said to one another 'who can be saved?' Jesus gazed at them. 'For men' he said 'it is impossible, but not for God: because everything is possible for God.'

What must I do to inherit eternal life?



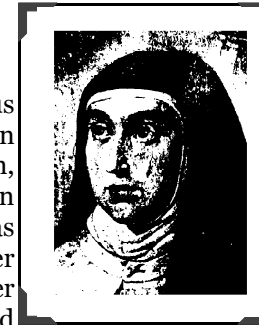
"What good must I do to have eternal life?" can only be found by turning one's mind and heart to the "One" who is good: "No one is good but God alone" (Mk 10:18; cf. Lk 18:19). Only God can answer the question about what is good, because he is the Good itself. To ask about the good, in fact, ultimately means to turn towards God, the fullness of goodness. Jesus shows that the young man's question is really a religious question, He is the source of man's happiness. The Ten Commandments lay the foundations for the vocation of man fashioned in the image of God; they prohibit what is contrary to the love of God and neighbor and prescribe what is essential to it. God wrote on the tables of the Law what men did not read in their hearts. The Lord's Sermon on the Mount, far from abolishing or devaluing the moral prescriptions of the Old Law, releases their hidden potential and has new demands that arise from them. It does not add new external precepts, but proceeds to reform the heart, the root of human acts, where man chooses between the pure and the impure so that with faith, hope, and charity are formed and with them the other virtues.

If you want to be perfect...

The way and at the same time the content of this perfection consist in the following of Jesus, once one has given up one's own wealth and very self. This is precisely the conclusion of Jesus' conversation with the young man: "Come, follow me" (Mt 19:21). It is an invitation to the marvellous grandeur which will be fully

perceived by the disciples after Christ's Resurrection, when the Holy Spirit leads them to all truth (cf. Jn 16:13).

**Saint Teresa of Avila
15th October**



St. Teresa of Jesus was born at Avila in Spain on 28 March, 1515 and died in 1582. Teresa was brought up by her saintly father, a lover of serious books, and a tender mother. After entering religious life she became very ill and nearly died. After a prolonged cure she was eventually healed by St. Joseph. During these years of suffering she began the practice of meditation and God blessed her with 'intellectual visions'. One vision depicted hell, a state for those who die in mortal sin - which inspired her to seek a more perfect life. The more she endeavored to do God's will the more powerfully did God work in her soul. The whole city of Avila was troubled by the reports of this nun contained in her autobiography *The Life*. Teresa also experienced a spiritual piercing or transverberation of the heart, the spiritual espousal and the mystical marriage. After many troubles and much opposition she founded numerous convents of Discalced Carmelites. St. Teresa's position among writers on mystical theology is unique. Under obedience she wrote four books which contain the best explanations of prayer and meditation. One is called the *Way of Perfection*.

**Alphonsus Ratisbonne
Atheist to Jesuit**

The extraordinary life of Alphonsus Ratisbonne, who was born a French Jew in 1814, and

converted miraculously in Rome from an atheist to a fervent Catholic in 1842. Alphonsus became a Jesuit Priest and then founded a religious order in Palestine to convert Jews to Christianity. His conversion was caused by a vision of Our Lady in the Church of Saint Andrew in Rome. At the time, the then French atheist was wearing the miraculous medal. This powerful sacramental is renowned for its efficacious blessings - hence its name.
