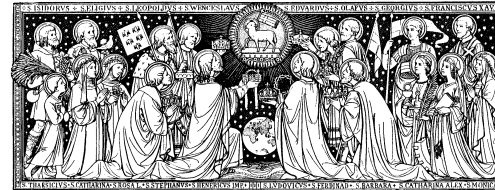
Mass = Sacrifice of the eternal High Priest - Jesus Christ

- 3). On the altar of Calvary at Jerusalem.

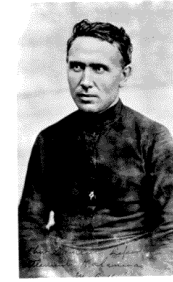


St. Teresa's Humility Hints

DAMIEN THE LEPER SAINT



Pope Benedict XVI canonized Father Damien, who was born Jozef De Veuster in 1840. He was a Roman Catholic priest from Belgium who cared for

leprosy victims on the Hawaiian island of Molokai from 1873 to 1889, when the disease killed him. Damien's compassion for the lepers led him to spend **sixteen years** in the "living graveyard that was Molokai," where he died at the age of forty-nine in service to people suffering from the terrible disease of leprosy. Damien never lost sight of his life's purpose, despite the many difficulties and sufferings he bore. It was only his faith that enabled him to endure the trials that his life's work caused him.
