Mass parts in Hymn Book - page 128 First Reading: I Kings 17: 10-16

Elijah the Prophet went off to Sidon. And when he reached the city gate, there was a widow gathering sticks; addressing her he said, 'Please bring me a little water in a vessel for me to drink.' She was setting off to bring it when he called after her. 'Please' he said 'bring me a scrap of bread in your hand.' 'As the Lord your God lives,' she replied 'I have no baked bread, but only a handful of meal in a jar and a little oil in a jug; I am just gathering a stick or two to go and prepare this for myself and my son to eat, and then we shall die.' But Elijah said to her, 'Do not be afraid, go and do as you have said; but first make a little scone of it for me and bring it to me, and then make some for yourself and for your son. For thus the Lord speaks, the God of Israel: "Jar of meal shall not be spent, jug of oil shall not be emptied, before the day when the Lord sends rain on the face of the earth." The woman went and did as Elijah told her and they ate the food, she, himself and her son. The jar of meal was not spent nor the jug of oil emptied, just as the Lord had foretold through Elijah.

Instead of

that, he has made his appearance once and for all, now at the end of the last age, to do away with sin by sacrificing himself. Since men only die once, and after that comes judgement, so Christ, too, offers himself only once to take the faults of many on himself, and when he appears a second time, it will not be to deal with sin but to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

WIDOW'S MITE

Both in the Old Testament reading and the Gospel there is mention of a poor widow. In ancient times, devoid of social benefits, such as the pension, or superannuation, a widow was a most vulnerable person. If she was poor her plight was then most tragic. Having nobody to assist her, or provide for her needs, or defend her rights, she was often the prey of predators, or just left to rot in her misery and destitution.

God's mercy seeks out such souls. He comes to their aid and provides for their needs. Note how the poor widow in Elijah's day was provided for by God. Yet she firstly had to trust in God and his ways. It is often the poor who after being tested are very generous. Having little they are not attached to what they have and thus are ready and willing to give. Sadly, it is often the rich and wealthy who have much that give little. Thus, the words of Jesus: "This poor widow has put more in than all who have contributed to the treasury; for they have all put in money they had over, but she from the little she had has put in everything she possessed, all she had to live on."

The Lord knows and sees all. He will reward us for our generosity in the next life. It matters little what notoriety we receive here for being generous, such rewards wither in time, but God's reward will endure for ever: Blessed are the poor of heart, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven !
